SUBJECT: Course Outcome

SOC UG 101: Introduction to Sociology - I

The Course intends to introduce and familiarize the students with basic concepts in Sociology, its origin, nature and scope. The students will also learn the relationship of Sociology with other disciplines.

SOC UG 201: Introduction to Sociology – II

This course supplements the understanding of Sociology imparted in a similar course in the previous semester.

SOC UG 301: Indian Society

The thrust of this course is on understanding the empirical realities of Indian society and the development of Sociology in India. The course enables the students to understand the various aspects of caste and tribal societies in the country.

SOC UG 401: Sociological Thinkers

The course intends to introduce the students to classical thinkers in Sociology. The students are expected to understand the theoretical formulations and arguments provided by these thinkers and develop insights to examine social phenomena.

SOC UG 501: Sociology of Family and Kinship

This course intends to introduce the students to the institution of family, marriage and kinship. It intends to familiarize the students with the basic conceptual understanding of these three institutions and expose the students to an understanding of particular kinship systems as found in North-East India.

SOC UG 502: Economic Sociology

The course intends to examine the interplay between economy and society. The students will learn the sociological approaches in understanding economic phenomena and economic systems prevalent in the modern world. They will also learn agrarian situation in India.

SOC UG 601: Sociology of Religion

The focus of this course is to provide an explanation towards the understanding of the institution of religion and its function in society. It will familiarize the students about the existence of religious organizations as well as religious movements in the national and regional context.

SOC UG 602: Political Sociology

This course intends to examine the interface between polity and society. Students will learn and be exposed to the various dimensions of political sociology such as political systems, elites and political parties.

SOC UG 603: Research Methodology

This course intends to introduce the students to understanding of social research. The students will learn about the various principles of the scientific method and its application in the discipline of Sociology.
