

On the 27th of September 2018, the Department of MA Political Science, Synod College held a special lecture on the 'Restoration of the Ecosystem for Sustainable Development and fighting Climate Change' delivered by Dr. Bremly W.B. Lyngdoh & Mr. Sai Kishore Nellore. The special programme was held at 3:00 pm in the MA 1st seminar hall.

The two speakers began their lecture by talking about the importance of trees and encouraged afforestation. They then proceeded to give general information about what is happening in Shillong at present pertaining to the environment & the issues related to it & how the environment issues and changes definitely affect our health. They also talked about what is happening to ecosystems around the world & their dwindling state. Further, they talked about the state of the air we breathe & the effects of human activities on the air leading to air pollution, widening of the ozone hole etc. It also affects human health & causes various respiratory diseases. They then brought up the conversation back to the importance of trees & how trees play a vital role in purifying the air.

The speakers also specifically mentioned about the declining rate of mangrove tress & their detrimental effect on the coastal ecosystem. They, therefore, worked with the local people in such areas in their endeavor to restore the ecosystem---discouraging cutting down of the mangrove trees and encouraging the planning of such trees.

Mention was also made about a project that was undertaken in Mawphlang (Project Saving Cloud Forest) where various measures were taken to ensure protection of existing trees & planting of new ones. Such measures included providing efficient rice cookers & LPG cylinders to the locals in order to reduce restoration.

Moreover, they spoke about the role of technology in planting trees which made the task in question relatively easier, less time consuming & also required less manpower. In this manner, drones are employed which shoot seeds encased in a biodegradable plastic pods toward the targeted area. Both the speakers emphasized their firm belief that indeed the act of initiation i.e planting trees is important but more so is the act of caring & nurturing the saplings. Apart from this, they also related to the students about the importance of green living & the advantages it brings thereof at the national as well the individual level.

After the lecture, the speakers, the teachers & the students engaged in an interactive session in which various questions were asked such as whether or not the drone technology can be implemented in the hilly region of North East India. The cost & advantages of green living particularly the use of solar panels, the Wahumkrah issue &

how to save the Umiam Lake were also addressed.

At the end of the lecture, they encouraged the teachers and the students to pursue green living & stand up to care for the environment beginning from one's own community & emphasized on a people - to people & village - to - village approach to make a difference in the environment.

#### The Special lecture delivered by prof. G.Haragopal

#### Date 19/03/19

A special programme was organised by the department of Political science (PG) Synod college, Shillong on the topic "Politics of Higher Education: Equity and Excellence". It was delivered by Prof. G. Haragopal who was currently a professor in NLSIU (National Law School of India University, Bangalore) and a civil right activist.

#### **DETAILS OF THE LECTURE**

With much of his zeal and enthusiasm, Prof Haragopal delivered his lecture in the presence of the faculty members of Synod College headed by the principal with the Teaching Staff along with BA and MA students.

At the very outset, he spoke about the necessity of protecting the education system in India by emphasizing on the two goals of education i.e., implementing conscience of a nation and responding towards the social needs. He further stressed on the sacred social relations between a society and an individual based on the public funded education and private education. On one hand, he defined public funded education as a system in which the society spends on education and in return the individual serves the society. It brings about equality where everyone can enjoy their right to education. But on the other hand, private education which demands great resources was challenged by him because it is confined to only particular sections of society and breeds inequality in society. In this kind of privatised education, an educated person looks at his job as a commercial zone where he can benefit directly which ruptures the relation between the educated and the society. He even talks about the unequal distribution of wealth which was brought about by privatization whereby 73% of wealth was enjoyed by one person and majority of the people depends on agriculture where labour force became rampant leading to inequality in our society.

Last but not the least, he mentioned that in order to rescue the Poor and for democracy and the nation to survive, education must be given without any discrimination which can be brought about by public funded education.

The Department of Botany under the DBT- star college Scheme organized a special lecture on the 27<sup>th</sup> April 2019, on the theme: "Scope of Horticulture"

The programme was chaired by Ms. N.C. Marbaniang (HOD) of Botany Department. She welcomed and introduced the Resource Person, Shri. A Dkhar, Dy. Director of Agriculture (Plant Protection), Shillong, Government of Meghalaya

Shri A. Dkhar spoke at length on the scope of horticulture in Meghalaya. The geo-climatic situation of Meghalaya offers an excellent scope for growing of different types of horticultural crops including fruits, vegetables, spices, and plantation crops, medicinal and aromatic plants of high economic value. The hilly terrains and land conditions of the state do not offer much scope in bringing additional area under the wet cultivation, but the state possesses vast potential for developing horticulture.

Horticulture in Meghalaya is on the path of a major transformation/paradigm shift and major positive changes are taking place in horticultural sector in the state:

The Technology Mission in Horticulture has effectively facilitated major area expansion, introduced new crops and technologies and provided visibility and focus for horticulture. New/non-traditional crops are relatively introduced into the state and are exemplified by crops like capsicum, broccoli, Strawberries, Cashew nuts, and flowers like Carnation, roses, Anthurium, Liliums, Leather leaf ferns, Gerbera, Orchids etc. leading to an expansion of marketable crops which generates additional income and employment amongst farmers.

Both indigenous and exotic vegetables are grown across a wide range of agro climatic zones. Cultivation of off-season cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli etc. has become a special feature in the state. A special effort has been made through the HMNEH Scheme to expand more areas under vegetable so as to meet the ever increasing demand of vegetables in NER. Meghalaya has tremendous potential for the development of horticulture to generate income

and employment for the farming community. A large extent of land is available in the form of fallows, cultivable waste and miscellaneous tree crops. Most of this land is in hill slopes and is more suitable for plantation and fruit crops than traditional agronomical crops. With diversity in elevation, temperature, topography and rainfall a variety of horticultural crops can be grown. The total geographical area of Meghalaya is 22, 429, 00 Ha. Approximately, out of which the net cropped area is 2.85 lakh ha. (12.73% of its geographical area). The unutilized potential area is about 5.55 lakh ha or 24.76 % of the total area.

Analysis of Variance (ANOVA) is a parametric statistical technique used to compare datasets. This technique was invented by R.A. Fisher in the 1920s, and is thus often referred to as Fisher's ANOVA, as well. It is similar in application to techniques such as t-test and z-test, in that it is used to compare means and the relative variance between them. However, analysis of variance (ANOVA) is best applied where more than 2 populations or samples are meant to be compared.

The analysis of variance originated in agrarian research and its language is thus loaded with such agricultural terms as blocks (referring to land) and treatments (referring to populations or samples) which are differentiated in terms of varieties of seed, fertilizers or cultivation methods.

Today however this analysis finds application in nearly every type of experimental design, in natural as well as social sciences.

### Types of ANOVA

Analysis of variance (ANOVA) has three types:

One way analysis: When we are comparing more than three groups based on one factor variable, then it said to be one way analysis of variance (ANOVA). For example, if we want to compare whether or not the mean output of three workers is the same based on the working hours of the three workers.

Two way analysis: When factor variables are more than two, then it is said to be two way analysis of variance (ANOVA). For example, based on working condition and working hours, we can compare whether or not the mean output of three workers is the same.

K-way analysis: When factor variables are k, then it is said to be the k-way analysis of variance (ANOVA).

## Analysis of variance (ANOVA) in SPSS

In SPSS, analysis of variance (ANOVA) can be performed in many ways. We can perform this test in SPSS by clicking on the option "one way ANOVA," available in the "compare means" option. When we are performing two ways or more than two ways analysis of variance (ANOVA), then we can use the "univariate" option available in the GLM menu. SPSS will give additional results as well, like the partial eta square, Power, regression model, post hoc, homogeneity test, etc. The post hoc test is performed when there is significant difference between groups and we want to know exactly which group has means that are significantly different from other groups.

#### Key terms

F -ratio: To calculate the F-ratio, the sum of the squares between groups will be divided by the sum of the square within a group.

Degree of freedom: To calculate the degree of freedom between the sums of the squares group, we will subtract one from the number of groups. The sum of the square within the group's degree of freedom will be calculated by subtracting the number of groups from the total observation.

BSS df = (g-1) for BSS is between the sum of squares, where g is the group, and df is the degree of freedom.

WSS df = (N-g) for WSS within the sum of squares, where N is the total sample size. Significance: At a predetermine level of significance (usually at 5%), we will compare and calculate the value with the critical table value. Today, however, computers can automatically calculate the probability value for F-ratio. If p-value is lesser than the predetermined significance level, then group means will be different. Or, if the p-value is greater than the predetermined significance level, we can say that there is no difference between the groups' mean.

Sum of square between groups: For the sum of the square between groups, we calculate the individual means of the group, and then we take the deviation from the individual mean for each group. And finally, we will take the sum of all groups after the square of the individual group. Sum of squares within group: In order to get the sum of squares within a group, we calculate the grand mean for all groups and then take the deviation from the individual group. The sum of all groups will be done after the square of the deviation.

## One -Way ANOVA

The one-way analysis of variance (ANOVA) is used to determine whether there are any statistically significant differences between the means of three or more independent (unrelated) groups.

The one-way ANOVA compares the means between the groups you are interested in and determines whether any of those means are statistically significantly different from each other. Specifically, it tests the null hypothesis:

Where  $\mu$  = group mean and k = number of groups. If, however, the one-way ANOVA returns a statistically significant result, we accept the alternative hypothesis (H<sub>A</sub>), which is that there are at least two group means that are statistically significantly different from each other.

## A BRIEF REPORT OF THE TWO DAY INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR ON EYE FOR AN EYE: CONFLICT IN SOUTH EAST ASIA

Organised by the English Dept, Synod College on 6" -7" November 2019

On the 6th -7th November, 2019, the English Dept. Synod College organised its first ever International Seminar on the theme Eye for an Eye: Conflict in South East Asia. This seminar which is interdisciplinary in scope and intent was jointly funded by Synod College, ICSSR, New Delhi, North Eastern Council and DIPR as its media partner. The two days seminar saw a host of eminent personalities, resource persons, scholars, artists, policy makers and students from the North Eastern region, the country and abroad converging on a common platform to debate and engage on a wide variety of themes related to conflict in its multi-dimensional aspect.



South East Asia, has been the hotspot of contestations and clashes through decades, whether it is the Khmer Rouge Cambodia, the Vietnam War, the Indonesian conflict or the more recent Myanmar - Rohingya crises, to name just a few. Hence, the reason for this particular topic. What can history teach us about the conflicts that have scarred these different nations and communities? 'In what ways has conflict shaped the consciousness and psyche of a people experiencing it? 'Can we truly chart a course to a future devoid of conflict, or at least minimize them? 'How is it perceived and expressed by writers and artistes in their work? These, and some other questions are what this seminar seeks to engage with. as is evident from the papers that were presented.

Another significant area that this interdisciplinary interaction touches upon, at a more local and personal level for this particular region of India. the North East, is the contribution it can make on policy talks on the Act East Policy of the Indian Govt.

because of the strategic positioning of North East India as a corridor that links the Indian sub-continent with South East Asia. Though India is geographically not part of S.E. Asia, yet, the position of its North Eastern states and the connection it seeks to have with S.E. Asia through this region makes the study of conflict in the present context a highly relevant one.



Yet another significant component of this seminar is the Art Exhibition. Aptly titled, Eyeing Conflict, this exhibition is a visual narrative that brings together 10 artistes from different states of the North East to explore and examine, from their perspective, the multi-dimensional aspects of conflict and contestation in our globalized world.



The Inauguration of both the Seminar and the Art Exhibition was graced by Shri Kyrmen Shylla. Honourable Minister of Social Welfare, Revenue Disaster Management, Govt of Meghalaya as the Chief Guest while the Keynote Address was given by Prof

Harshana Rambukwella, Director of Post Graduate Institute of English, Open University of Sri Lanka and Honorary Faculty, School of English, University of Hong Kong, Other noted speakers in the seminar were Prof Fakrul Alam from the University of Dhaka,



Bangladesh, Baidik Bhattacharya from the Centre of Study of Developing Societies, New Deihi, Nimmi Kurian, Centre for Policy Research and Academic Advisor, India China Institute, The New School, New York, Kethoser Kevichusa from Nagaland and author of award-wirining book Forgiveness and Politics: A Critical Appraisal, Sukalpa Bhattacharjee, Prasenjit Biswas, and Javanta K. Sarmah.

On day two of the seminar, a Panel Discussion was held to deliberate on how to chalk out the possible ways and means of resolving conflict and seek for peace building and better understanding between nations and people not only at the level of discourse but also at the grass root level. The discussion was moderated by Prot T. K. Kharbamon, Director of EFLU, Shillong and the panelists were Shri Frederick. R. Kharkongor, IAS, Shri H. Nongpluh, IPS and Additional DGP, Harshana Rambukwella and Kethoser Kevichusa.



The Valedictory Address was delivered by Prof Prasanta Das, Dean of Humanities, Teapur University.

It is hoped that the seminar, through the multilevelled interaction of the academic, the policy making process, the visual and the performing arts, will meaningfully contribute to the scholarship of Conflict and Peace studies and also help foster a spirit of constructive cooperation and dialogue in a world pockmarked by violence, thereby, generating a better understanding of ourselves, of each other, and of the urgent need to respect one another as citizens of a shared planet.

Sericulture is the art and technology of raising of silkworm for production of raw silk yarn. Silk fiber is a protein which is produced from the silk gland of silk worm. Silk is a natural fiber and queen of textiles and is one of the most expensive and demanded fiber in the world. Sericulture activities may be broadly divided in to two sector -

- 1. Pre cocoon
- 2. Post cocoon

There are different species of silkworm and India produces four kinds of silk – mulberry, tasar, muga and eri. Some of the major pests of silkworm are white flies, stem borer, mealy bug.

The raw silk is used in the manufacture of woven materials and the knitted fabrics for the preparation of garments, parachutes, parachute cords, fishing lines, insulation coil for telephones, tyres of racing cars, etc.





# COEFFICIENT OF CORRELATION BY PEARSON'S PRODUCT MOMENT METHOD

#### FOR

## GROUPED AND UNGROUPED DATA

## Grouped and Ungrouped Data:

The word data refers to information that is collected and recorded. It can be in form of numbers, words, measurements and much more. There are two types of data and these are qualitative data and quantitative data. The difference between the two types of data is that quantitative data is used to describe numerical information. For instance, the measurement of temperature would fall under this kind of data. On the other hand, qualitative data is used to describe information in words. After collecting data, it needs to be organized hence the need to separate grouped data from ungrouped data. Both are useful forms of data but the difference between them is that ungrouped data is raw data. This means that it has just been collected but not sorted into any group or classes. On the other hand, grouped data is data that has been organized into groups from the raw data.

## Meaning of Correlation Analysis:

The correlation analysis refers to the techniques used in measuring the closeness of the relationship between the variables. According to Croxton and Cowden, "When the relationship is of a quantitative nature, the appropriate statistical tool for discovering and measuring the relationship and expressing it in brief formula is known as correlation". In the words of Simpson and Kafka, "Correlation Analysis deals with the association between two or more variables".

## Types of Correlation:

Three of the most important ways of classifying correlation are:

- Positive and Negative Correlation: Whether correlation is positive or negative would depend upon the direction of change of the variables. If both the variables are varying in the same direction, then correlation is said to be positive and if the variables are varying in opposite direction, then correlation is said to be negative.
- 2. Simple, Partial and Multiple Correlation: When only two variables are studied it is a problem of simple correlation, 'when three or more variables are studied it is a problem of either multiple or partial correlation. In multiple correlation three or more

variables are studied simultaneously, whereas in partial correlation we recognize more than two variables, but consider only two variables to be influencing each other, the effect of other influencing variables being kept constant.

3. Linear and Non-Linear Correlation: - If the amount of change in one variable tends to bear a constant ratio to the amount of change in the other variable then the correlation is said to be linear. Correlation would be called non-linear or curvilinear if the amount of change in one variable does not bear a constant ratio to the amount of change in the other variable.

## Methods of Studying Correlation:

- 1. Scatter Diagram Method
- 2. Graphic Method
- 3. Karl Pearson's Coefficient of Correlation
- 4. Coefficient of Correlation by Rank Differences
- 5. Concurrent Deviation Method
- 6. Method of Least Squares

## KARL PEARSON'S COEFFICIENT OF CORRELATION

Correlation coefficients are used in statistics to measure how strong a relationship is between two variables. There are several types of correlation coefficient: Pearson's correlation (also called Pearson's r) is a correlation coefficient commonly used in linear regression. In fact, when anyone refers to the correlation coefficient, they are usually talking about Pearson's. Karl Pearson measure of correlation between two variables is called the coefficient of correlation and is also known as product moment correlation. The Pearson coefficient of correlation is denoted by the symbol r and the formula for computing it is as follows

$$r = \frac{\sum xy}{NS_X S_Y}$$

where x and y are deviation scores, that is,

$$x = X - \overline{X}$$
 and  $y = Y - \overline{Y}$ 

 $S_X$  and  $S_Y$  are sample standard deviations, that is,

$$S_X = \sqrt{\frac{\sum (X - \bar{X})^2}{N}}$$

Correlation coefficient can also be calculated without taking deviations of items either from the actual mean or assumed, i.e., by taking the actual values of X and Y and applying the formula:

$$r = \frac{n(\Sigma xy) - (\Sigma x)(\Sigma y)}{\sqrt{\left[n\Sigma x^2 - (\Sigma x)^2\right]\left[n\Sigma y^2 - (\Sigma y)^2\right]}}$$

## Interpretation of r:

Correlation coefficient formulas are used to find how strong a relationship is between data.

The formulas return a value between -1 and 1, where:

- 1 indicates a strong positive relationship.
- -1 indicates a strong negative relationship.
- A result of zero indicates no relationship at all.

A correlation coefficient of 1 means that for every positive increase in one variable, there is a positive increase of a fixed proportion in the other. For example, shoe sizes go up in (almost) perfect correlation with foot length.

A correlation coefficient of -1 means that for every positive increase in one variable, there is a negative decrease of a fixed proportion in the other. For example, the amount of gas in a tank decreases in (almost) perfect correlation with speed.

Zero means that for every increase, there isn't a positive or negative increase. The two just aren't related.

The <u>absolute value</u> of the correlation coefficient gives us the relationship strength. The larger the number, the stronger the relationship. For example, |-.75| = .75, which has a stronger relationship than .65.

## Correlation of Grouped Data:

When the number of observations is large, the data are often classified into two-way frequency distribution called a correlation table. The formula for calculating the coefficient of correlation is given by:

$$r = \frac{N \Sigma f d_x d_y - (\Sigma f d_x) (\Sigma f d_y)}{\sqrt{N \Sigma f d_x^2 - (\Sigma f d_x)^2} \sqrt{N \Sigma f d_y^2 - (\Sigma f d_y)^2}}$$



#### **REPORT ON NATIONAL SCIENCE DAY CELEBRATION -2020**

The Department of Physics, Synod College celebrated the National Science Day on the 28<sup>th</sup> of February, 2020. The theme for this year's celebration was "Women in Science".

The department arranged a program to celebrate this day by organising a lecture talk on the theme "Women in Science" by Smti. G. A. Kharsyntiew, faculty member of the department.

All the Physics honours students of the college participated. There were altogether 30 students along with the teachers who were 5 in number who attended the program.

The programme was chaired by Shri M. D. Wanswett, Assistant Professor of the department who welcomed all the students and the teachers. Smti. G. A. Kharsyntiew in her address spoke about the National Science Day and explained that it was first celebrated on February 28, 1987. She also reminded the student about the great scientist that India produced Dr. C. V. Raman who discovered the Raman Effect and was awarded the Noble prize for his work in 1930. National Science Day is now celebrated every year to commemorate this discovery of the Raman Effect. The speaker also highlighted the objectives of celebrating this national science day.

Speaking on the theme "Women in Science" the speaker noted that women's contribution to science covers a wide range of subjects from mathematics, chemistry, biology, bio-chemistry, physics etc. and this is a very vast topic to discuss, so she restricted herself to highlight the achievements of a few prominent women scientist working in the field of physics and its related areas. The Speaker spoke about the illustrious career and achievements of the most famous woman scientist in the world Madam Marie Curie who was awarded the Noble prize twice, for Physics in 1903 and for Chemistry in 1911. The speaker shed light on the work of Marie Curie and her husband Pierre who were both working on radioactivity. They managed to extract two previously unknown elements polonium and radium both more reactive than uranium. Her research was crucial to the development of X-rays in surgery. Her daughter Irene also followed in her parents footsteps and also won the Noble Prize in Chemistry in 1935 along with her husband Frederic Joliot.

The Speaker also spoke about the contribution of other female scientist such as Lise Meitner an Austrian-Swedish scientist who contributed to the discovery of nuclear fission.

Referring to the contribution of women scientist in India the speaker spoke about some of the reputed scientist such as Janaki Ammal who was the first Indian scientist to receive the Padma Shri award in 1977 and went on to become the Director General of the Botanical

Survey of India. Another prominent scientist was Kamala Sohonie who had to battle a lot of gender biased prejudice and managed to enter into one of the prestigious science institutes of the country. The speaker highlighted the difficulties faced by women in the days before the 20<sup>th</sup> century when women scientist were a miniscule minority and had to endure inconveniences, restrictions and even humiliation compared with their male counterparts. The Speaker said that in today's world things have greatly improved and women are encouraged to take up science. India today has a large pool of women scientists who are contributing to the development of the country and are respected for the work that they do.

The Speaker also spoke about the new generation of women scientist in India such as Tessy Thomas known as the "missile lady" who is involved as the project director for the Agni IV and Agni V missile in DRDO and is the first Indian woman to have headed a missile program. Another prominent scientist is Ritu Karidhal Srivastava who was the Deputy Operations Director to India's Mars Orbital Mission. The students also participated by interacting enthusiastically.

The Speaker concluded by encouraging students to be inspired and encouraged by these women who inspite of challenges were able to do ground breaking work in their field and prove that they are no less capable than their male counterparts. These women should be the role models of future young scientist of the country and students are to emulate them and shine in life.

After the lecture the vote of thanks was delivered by Shri. G. S. Kharkongor, faculty member of the department and the programme came to a close.

# REPORT ON THE OBSERVATION OF INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY ON THE 9<sup>TH</sup> MARCH 2020

The Office of the District legal Services authority, East Khasi Hills District, in collaboration with the Women Cell and the Departments of English and Sociology of Synod College, organised a special programme on the 9<sup>th</sup> March 2020, on the occasion of International Women's Day.

The Theme of the programme was 'I am Generation Equality: Realizing Women's Rights.' The Covener of the Women Cell, Synod College, Smti I. Pyngrope welcomed the Resource persons, staff of the District Legal Services Authority, Faculty of the College, as well as the Students. The programme began with a speech by Smti Daisily Thangkhiew, Advocate who presented the legal aspect of Women's Rights. She emphasised the importance of legal literacy and the need to know and understand laws that concern women, especially in terms of sexual abuse, juvenile crime, domestic violence and maintenance. This was followed by a speech by Smti Christine Fanaii, Deputy Superintendent of Police, East Khasi Hills, who gave an account of the role of the Police in safeguarding the rights of women and children. She also spoke at length about crimes against women in the context of the state of Meghalaya. The Assistant Director, Meghalaya Administrative Training Institute, Smti Ivyreen Warjri gave an exhaustive presentation on the status of women, globally and nationally with an emphasis on the state of Meghalaya. Shri D.S. Marbaniang, Secretary District Legal Services Authority, reiterated the role of the LSA in providing free legal service to women in search of justice and protection of their rights. There was a great deal of interaction between the students and the Resource Persons on many issues concerning women. The programme closed with a meaningful item presented by the Manbha Foundation. 




# A Brief Summary on the Programme "Addressing Students' Emotional Health Issues and Well Being"

# A Report of the Special Lecture on "World Mental Health Day" (10<sup>th</sup> October, 2020)

The Department of Sociology organised an online special lecture on "Adolescents Mental Health and Social Stigma" on the 10" October 2020. The programme was conducted to mark the World Mental Health Day, 2020 thereby drawing the attention of students and teachers alike regarding the importance of mental health and highlighting the problems associated with it. Mrs. Monica N. Laloo who is the convener of the programme chaired the sessions of the lecture. It was attended by the 3" and 5" semester students of the Sociology Department numbering around 84 of them besides the faculty members of the Department. The two speakers were Dr. Arvind Nongpuir, MD, DPM, Assistant Professor, I/C Psychiatry, NEIGRIHMS, Shillong and Major, Dapple D. Wankhar, Assistant Professor, Armed Forces Medical College, Nursing, Pune.

The speakers gave a brief account regarding mental health around the world. Most of the mental health conditions account for 16% of the global burden of diseases and injury in people aged between 10 to 19 years. Most of the mental health diseases occur at the age of 14 but in many cases they are undetected and untreated. Suicide is the third main cause of death in individuals between 15 to 19 years old. Children and adolescents develop different mental disorders. Children less than 10 years of age develop disorders like mental retardation or learning disabilities while adolescents develop functional mental disorders. Any change of behavior from the normal day to day behavior of the child should be taken into account and help from a medical expert should be sought. Adolescent mental issues include emotional, behavioral and eating disorders which can also lead to suicide and selfharm, risk taking behaviours, psychosis and alcohol abuse.

Dr. Arvind Nonguir highlighted the different anxiety disorders during adolescents such as social anxiety disorder, generalized anxiety disorder, panic anxiety disorder and acrophobia. Childhood depression which is on the rise may not be noticeable in the child as in the case of an adult. A child is not able to express his or her emotions and hence certain actions such as anger outburst and tantrums may be indications of depression. Adolescence is a period marked by frequent mood swings, irritability and argumentativeness which are normal. However, any change of behavior from the normal day to day behavior should be taken into account and seek appropriate help.

Dr. Nongpuir also spoke about 'stresses'. He pointed out that stress is present in almost all situations and it is a part of our day to day life. The important issue related to stress is how we handle it. The condition of too much stress may result in self harm and at times taking one's own life. An individual needs to learn how to handle various situations of stress. One can also seek help from parents, friends and teachers if they feel that they cannot handle the stress. The support system is very important in the day to day life of an adolescent to fight against stress.





Some common indications of stress include disturbed sleep, lack of appetite and lethargy. Subtle indicators of stress for an adolescent include patterns such as coming late to class, problem of concentrating in studies and not wanting to talk to friends. An individual should reach out to others when he or she feels stressed as it is very important on how one copes with stress rather than what causes the stress. It is usually the peers, family and teachers who recognises the problems rather than the individual. Appointment of counselors in schools and colleges can go a long way in helping the child and adolescents to recognize their problems. He also focuses on the problems and issues caused by the Covid19 pandemic. He highlighted that normal classes have changed to online mode in which some students are able to adapt the change and some are not. The pandemic has also created fear among the people of contracting the virus, individuals are not able to meet their near and dear ones and the future is unknown hence it increases the anxiety level among the individuals. This fear and anxiety has created stress among the people.

Major Dapple D. Wankhar focused on issues related to mental illness such as social stigma and the like. This little word 'stigma' causes big problems such as disrespect, discrimination and discourages people from getting help. Stigma can either be overt or subtle. Overt stigma are negative comments about people with mental health illness and discrimination whereas subtle signs are the ideas that an individual has about people suffering from mental health such as being harmful or dangerous. Mental health stigmas are of two types: social stigma and perceived or self-stigma. Social stigma is the discrimination and prejudice faced by a person who is suffering from mental health conditions as a result of the psychiatric label given to them. Perceived or self-stigma

is the personal perception of the individual suffering from mental health conditions. There are many causes which lead to social stigma of people suffering from mental health, some of which are ignorance, lifestyle, media stereotyping behaviour of mental illness, fear, lack of treatment facilities, lack of information system and economic instability.

She also spoke at length about the effects of social stigma on an individual who suffers from mental health. Social stigma leads to detrimental effects upon an individual such as loss of confidence and low self esteem, failure to seek medical help and counseling due to the shame associated with it, loss of job and lack of employment, rejection, feeling of under value and isolation. Stigma can be manifested in many ways such as physical stigma where people living with mental illness are not allowed to share the same physical space with others. Social stigma takes place when individuals are isolated socially from the rest of society and eventually the individuals social structure starts dissolving. Verbal stigma is when people use verbal abuse, pejorative language to people suffering from mental illness. Lastly institutional stigma is when the person suffering from mental illness loses his or her job and faces discriminatory practices due to their condition. Towards the end of her lecture, she also talked about the ways in which we can fight against stigmatisation associated with mental illness like educating people about the misconceptions of mental illness and replacing them with facts. Other ways to fight against stigmatization related to mental illness is by changing public attitudes about mental illness by having direct interaction with those suffering from mental illness and protesting the negative behaviour associated towards mental illness.

The Science departments of Synod College, Shillong organised an online programme on the 14th December, 2020 hosted on google meet to celebrate the International year of Plant Health-2020 (IYPH-2020) under the DBT-Star college scheme. This programme has been sponsored by the Department of Bio-Technology, Ministry of Science & Technology, Government of India.

The programme was started with online registration with a total of 100 participants including the resource persons. Subsequently, the inaugural function took off at 10.00 AM which was presided by Dr. G. Lyngdoh, Co-ordinator IQAC. Dr. R.M. Lyngdoh, Principal delivered the welcome address for the distinguished speakers, faculties and students. In his speech he provided some glimpse on the importance of plant health and the problem faced by plants due to diseases, poor environmental conditions and stress. He also appreciated the Science departments for taking the initiatives and making this programme a huge success.

The entire programme was allocated into two sessions:

#### Special lecture by Dr. L.C. Borah, Professor & H.O.D of Plant Pathology, A.A.U, Jorhat, Assam

He talks on the importance of plant protection in general and the protection of crop against plant diseases in particular. Pathogens can have a severe impact on plant health. Diseases management is an essential component for the maintenance of plant health. The speaker emphasized on the practiced of organic farming and used of organic pest management to control pest, as overuse of chemicals in the past century has degraded the environment in alarming way.

He also spoke on the importance of healthy soil in plant health management and elaborated the role of beneficial soil micro-organism viz. plant growth promoting N-fixing cyanobacteria, rhizobacteria, mycorrhizae, plant disease suppressive beneficial bacteria, stress tolerance entophytes and bio-degrading microbes in promoting plant growth and protecting against pathogens and pest.

Besides, the speaker highlighted some of the microbial bio-pesticides formulations developed at Assam Agricultural University (AAU) like Biofor Pf-2 a vermicompost based biopesicides, Biotime tale based and liquid biopesticides, Biometa, Biogreen and Biogreen-L. He thus encouraged the use of beneficial microbes for the benefit of soil fertility, crop growth and pest control.

#### Special lecture by Dr. P. Debnath, Professor, Department of Virology, A.A.U. Jorhat, Assam.

The speaker delivered a lecture on the topic "Protecting plant health: Safeguarding future". He emphasised the different techniques on how to identify, diagnosed and combat plant diseases. In order to fight against various infectious diseases caused by insect, birds, rats, nematodes, etc., with normal control measures practices is not enough to keep in check the health and overall growth of the plant. Whereas, knowing the root caused that give rise to diseases causing agents of the plants is important. Various methods have been highlighted to serve for the purposes like biological methods, serological methods, western blotting, lateral flow device, PCR etc.

In conclusion he also mentioned the general plant diseases management practices such as avoidances, exclusion, eradication etc.

Composite fish culture is the technology in which more than one type of compatible fish species are cultured simultaneously in the same pond. The main principle of composite fish culture is to increase the growth of fish through full utilization of natural food organisms in all the niches present in the pond, supplemented by artificial feeding. The different compatible fish species which are of mutual benefit to each other have different feeding habit and habitat, therefore there is no competition for food and space. There are three types of culture system – extensive culture, semi extensive culture system and intensive culture system. The fishes selected in pond culture are such that they have a faster growth rate, able to find food in ponds, adaptation to climate, resistence to disease and tolerance to the changes in the physio-chemical factors. Altogether six species of carps are cultured – three indeginous carps which includes catla, rohu and mrigal, and three exotic carps which includes silver carp, grass carp and common carp.

There are three steps involved in the composite fish culture

- 1. Pre stocking management
- 2. Stocking management
- 3. Post stocking management

Harvesting is normally done after one year when the fish has attained marketable size. A production of 2.5 to 3 tonnes/ha can be obtained in a year and this can vary depending on the agro climatic conditions and management practices.



**Report on National Science Day Celebration 2021**



The Department of Sociology, Synod College, Shillong organised an online programme on "Covid19 Vaccination Awareness Campaign" on the 1" May, 2021. The resource person for the programme was Dr. R. Laloo, District Immunization Officer, West Khasi Hills District. The programme was chaired by Smt. M. N. Laloo and attended by the students of the College. The Coordinator, IQAC, Synod College, Dr. (Mrs) G. Lyngdoh, gave the welcome speech which was followed by the speech from the resource person.

Dr. R. Laloo addressed the participants on Information, Education and Communication. He also gave clarification to the students regarding the Covid19 vaccination which is going on in the state of Meghalaya and the country as a whole. He highlighted about the numerous rumours in our community, particularly, in East Khasi Hills district related to the vaccination. He stated that the number of persons coming forward for the vaccination has not been very encouraging and therefore having a forum like this to speak to young people regarding these vaccines is an opportunity which he did not want to miss. There is an exponential growth in Covid19 cases in our state due to a new strain of the virus. The reproduction rate of this disease has increased which means the probability of a disease passing from one person to another is higher, Initially, the scientists calculated this reproduction rate at two, that is, one person who is carrying this disease can spread to two people but looking at the present trend they are now coming up with a figure of four to six similar to the measles virus. This means that every positive patient can spread to about four to six people. This is indeed a very high reproduction rate. The government has come up with strategies to combat Covid19 and one of them is vaccination. The first strategy is containment. The recent directives by the government whereby they're imposing lockdown and have vehicles put off the road; public transport has been affected and selective opening and closure of shops are all part of that strategy of containment. Another strategy for containment is the establishment of micro containment zones or simply containment zones. Positive patients in any locality or in any building or in any area are kept under containment and this has had a huge

impact in slowing down the spread of the disease.

The second strategy to control the spread of this disease is vaccination. He reminded that the covid19 vaccination in Meghalaya was initiated since the 16° of January 2021 and that it is going on in different phases. Initially, the vaccination programme targeted all the healthcare workers that includes doctors, nurses, lab technicians, pharmacists, ashas anganwadi workers and frontline workers i.e., those people who have a probability of coming into contact with a lot of people. Even people working in hazardous jobs were also included in this phase. With regard to the common people, the government stated that those above 59 years of age were to get the vaccine which was then reduced to 45 years of age. At present the government is rolling out the vaccination drive to people above 18 years. Our state and India as a whole have a shortage of equipment, be it ventilators, oxygen cylinders or even the medicines. That is why the two strategies that is containment and vaccination are very important. This covid19 vaccine are of different types and the most common and widely used is the CoviShield vaccine which is made by Serum Institute of India. CoviShield is a viral vector vaccine and the technology for making viral vector vaccines has been there since the 1990's. In India we are using the CoviShield which is the viral vector vaccine in which everyone who needs to get vaccinated will get two shots of this vaccine. They will be given on either arm which could be the left or right which is usually given on the non-dominant arm. The minimum time between two doses is 28 days. He also clarified that if one is missing the second shot within the 28 to 42 days, it's not a problem as one can still take it up to three months that is up to 90 days. However, he advised not to miss the second shot and to take it on schedule.

He also highlighted some of the side effects of the vaccination which are common in all vaccines. Some side effects of the covid19 vaccination are like fever which could be high grade fever or low-grade fever, body ache and knee ache; one can get general weakness or malaise, nausea and even vomiting. These are the normal side effects which do occur after vaccination. There are no reports of adverse events in Meghalaya. One of the most dangerous adverse events which can occur after vaccination is something called anaphylactic shock. It occurs when a person is allergic to any one of the ingredients or the compounds contained in the vaccine. Dr. R. Laloo further states that research by governmental or non-governmental institutions have been taken up to make sure that no untoward incidents occur after vaccination. People who are not eligible for vaccination as of now are pregnant women and women who are lactating or breastfeeding infants who are under six months of age.

There are a lot of misinformation, hearsay and rumours regarding vaccination and vaccines. There are rumours that this vaccine is being used for population control and that it's going to cause infertility in men and women so on and so forth. People with co-morbidities should take the vaccine. Co-morbidities are any chronic disease which a person is currently suffering from People with co-morbidity should be given a priority when it comes to vaccination because it was seen from data not only in India but internationally that people who suffer from these morbidities have a high probability of dying of covid19 virus.

The next session was an interactive session with the resource person. The participants in the programme asked a number of questions and clarified their doubts with Dr. R. Laloo. The interactive session was then followed by a vote a thanks. Overall, the programme was well received.

Besides the curricular teaching-learning exercise, the Department of Political Science (UG), Synod College used to organize/conduct a number of extracurricular activities for the students. One such activity carried out on a regular basis is a special lecture. Normally, the special lecture is a one hour programme in which the invited speaker addresses and interacts with the students on a particular theme set by the Department. The special lecture for the year 2021 was held on the 17<sup>th</sup> of June on the theme "Pursuing Higher Education: Challenges and Opportunities". The resource person for the lecture was Dr. Korsi Donrene Kharshiing, Assistant Professor, Department of Psychology, Jamia Millia Islamia University, New Delhi. Due to the Covid19 pandemic, the lecture was conducted online via google meet. The programme was attended by students of BA 6<sup>th</sup> Semester of both the Day and Morning Shift in the presence of all the faculty members of the Department. Mr. Banshan Marwein, a former student of the Department and a current PhD scholar of JNU attended the programme as a special invitee.

The programme was chaired by Dr. A. W. Rani who is also the teacher in-charge/convener of such programmes/activities in the Department. #### Gist of the lecture







Towards the end of the programme, students were offered to contact the speaker and posed their queries via chat box. The speaker answered many queries raised by the participants.



# Report on the Lecture organised by the committee on the 16th September, 2021

The Discipline and Cleanliness Committee conducted a lecture on the 16<sup>th</sup>September ,2021 on the theme "Discipline in the times of Covid-19". The resource person for this lecture was Dr. R. Allya Joint Director of Health Services and Project Director, Meghalaya Aids Control Society. This programme was conducted online and the timing of the programme was at 6pm.

The objective of organising the online lecture talk is to sensitise the students of the college on the importance of maintaining self-discipline in following all the protocols and SOP's issued by the health department in our day to day life so as to mitigate the spread of Covid -19 in our community and to help fight the disease.

The Discipline and Cleanliness Committee of the college felt the urgent need to stress on this important aspect of self-discipline as a key factor in the fight against Covid -19. Creating awareness and highlighting the covid appropriate behaviour and the importance of vaccination would go a long way in helping society overcome this disease.

In this programme 10 students were invited from each department which included 15 undergraduate Honours departments of the Day Section, 4 undergraduate Honours departments of the morning section and 2 post graduate departments. A single teacher from each of the above departments was also invited for the programme. Altogether there were about 159 students which consist of 66 male and 93 female students. The total number of teachers who attended the programme was 28 in all which included the members of the Discipline and Cleanliness committee. There were 8 male teachers and 20 female teachers.

The programme was chaired by Smti. G.A. Kharsyntiew, Convener Discipline and Cleanliness committee. The welcome speech was delivered by Dr. R. M. Lyngdoh, Principal Synod College. The resource person Dr. R. Allya gave a very stimulating and interesting lecture. She was able to make the lecture very interactive and students came forward to pose a large number of questions. The resource person highlighted that covid -19 belong to the family of coronavirus which include SARS and MERS and is highly contagious and has high fatality rate. She also highlighted that it is a virus which is evolving and no one can predict how it will behave. Therefore the stress is on trying to minimise the spread of the disease by adopting covid appropriate behaviour.

Dr. R. Allya talked about the different covid appropriate behaviour such as proper wearing of face mask which would be effective in preventing the spread of the disease, maintaining social distance and cleanliness especially hand washing all of which are critical in the fight

against the disease and how negligence on our part can sometimes lead to tragic circumstances. She talked about our responsibility not only for ourselves but also to ensure the safety of our friends, family and loved ones. The resource person also talked about the importance of vaccination and she address a large number of questions from the students and was able to shed light on the many misgivings and misinformation about it. She encouraged students that to contain the spread of the disease is entirely in our control by strictly adhering to the norms of covid appropriate behaviour and through vaccination. She also highlighted the importance of vaccination through the sharing of data and informed how vaccination has led to decrease in hospitalisation and fatality of covid cases. The students interacted enthusiastically but due to paucity of time not all questions could be address by the resource person. The meeting was brought to a close by a vote of thanks from Dr. M. Dunai , member of the Discipline and Cleanliness committee who thanked the Principal, the Vice Principals, the Co-ordinator of the IQAC ,the resource person , the teachers and students of the various departments who participated in the programme as well as the technical team of the college who made arrangements for the programme to be conducted online.



Horticulturehas an enormous significance in enriching the diets in which fruits and vegetables acts as an integral part of a healthy balanced nutritious diet which contains essential elements, vitamins, antioxidants, minerals etc that help in building a healthy body and mind. On the other hand, insufficient intake of fruits and vegetables is estimated to cause around 14% of deaths from gastro-intestinal cancer worldwide. Furthermore, horticulture can generate income and is a source of livelihood to the people. To meet the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs, he emphasized on how fruits and vegetables production should tend to be labour and skill intensively by practicing good agricultural methods like improved seed and planting materials, integrated pest management, organic farming, soil amendments etc., and by harnessing other techniques of horticulture like multicropping system, hydroponics, and robotic farming. Following the first speaker, the second speaker Dr. Gino Sangmadiscussed about Agripreneurship: A way forward. He successfully deliberated about the concepts of Agripreneurship on how agriculture can pave a way in designing, launching, and running new business which is often initially a small business. In action, agripreneur ensures selfsufficient production, foodsecurity, income security to farmers, employment generation and national economic growth. In addition, agripreneurship has many potential areas especially in the field of horticulture such as production of agro-inputs, organic farming, floriculture, beverages, processed products and many more.

Thereafter, the thought-provoking and enlightened speech from the two resourcepersons the webinar was closed with a gratified vote of thanks proposed by Dr. W. kharmawphlang, gratifying everyone associated in the programme, the two resource persons, Principal and Vice Principals of

the College, faculties, and students and especially the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India for being the backbone of this celebration.




# REPORT OF THE SPECIAL LECTURE HELD BY THE MATHEMATICS DEPARTMENT





Centre for Historical Research Synod College (CHRSC) in collaboration with the Department of Arts and Culture, Government of Meghalaya

is organizing a Webinar on "A Retrospection into Meghalaya's 50 years journey of Statehood" on the 21st - 22nd October 2021

Concept note - The Khasi, Jaintia and Garo tribes had their own independent kingdoms/states until they came under British administration in the nineteenth century. Residing in the present state of Meghalaya they have taken part in the freedom struggle and were integrated to the Indian Union at the time of India's independence in 1947 as part of Assam under the two constituted autonomy districts.

The movement for a separate hill state came about when the indigenous people wanted to reassert the protection of their identity as minorities in the composite state of Assam. It was one of the movements which can be glorified and reminisced due to its nonviolent nature from its beginning till the schievement of its objectives. In 1968, the Government of India announced a scheme for constituting an autonomous state within the state of Assam comprising certain areas specified in the Sixth Schedule to the Constitution. Accordingly, the Assam Reorganisation (Meghalaya) Act of 1960 was enacted for the formation of an autonomous state. After the Parliament passed the North-Eastern Areas (Reorganisation) Act, 1971, Meghalaya was conferred a full statehood on the 21st January 1972 with two districts - the United Khasi Hills and Jainta Hills, and the Garo Hills.

On the 21st January 2022, the state will commemorate its fifty years of Statehood and hence remembering and honouring the contributions of the leaders for their relentless efforts towards the creation of a separate state is indeed a momentous occasion. Moreover, recognizing the involvement of individuals, who have brought laurels to the State in various fields over the years, is the primacy of a State. The State has made significant progress in various sectors and achieved several milestones in development, governance and in delivering service to the people, however, while reflecting on the State's journey of forty nine years, there are also challenges that need introspection, in the process, it strives to achieve the collective aspirations of the stakeholders and ensure that it is in alignment with the past as well as the present reality. However, there are constraints that the State is also facing in the path of achieving its targets and expectations. Initiatives have to be taken to embark and formulate strategies and policies to tackle, to maintain equilibrium and preparedness to overcome any challenges in the near future.

#### A BRIEF REPORT ON

#### ONE DAY NATIONAL WEBINAR ON WASTE MANAGEMENT

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2021

The Science Departments, Synod College Shillong under the DBT- Star College Scheme organised a one day national webinar on Waste Management on the 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2021. The webinar was hosted on google meet platform where a large number of participants including faculties from different Colleges, universities, research scholar, students as well as officials from government and non-government organizations attended the webinar. The programme started with an inaugural function at 10:00 a.m., chaired by Dr. M. Rani, Vice Principal, Synod College, Shillong and Dr. R.M. Lyngdoh, Principal, Synod College delivered the inaugural address.

The entire programme was divided into two sessions in which each session was allotted with two esteemed speakers.

Session 1: The first session was chaired by Dr. M. Rani, Vice Principal, Synod College.

**Lecture-1:** Presented by Prof. Sadhan Kumar Ghosh, Chief Co-Ordinator Centre for Sustainable Development & Resourse Efficiency Management Jadavpur University, Kolkata.

Prof. Sadhan Kumar Ghosh specifically talks about Waste management- problems, Solutions and Research. He stated that waste generation is by default, but management or segregation of waste is very important to conserve, preserve and protect our environment and apart from it, waste can be considered also as one of the natural resources where huge income can be generated from it. He suggested some solutions pertaining to the pollutions of microplastics which are very harmful to health viz., legal support, technology support, Bio-medical waste management and e-waste management. Through his findings it was interesting to hear that in India waste management has improve due to implementation of various schemes such as Swatch Bharat mission and many more. He even inspires our College to take up this responsibility to manage the waste by having at least three bins for proper segregation of different types of waste.

Lecture-2: Presented by Prof. Ajay Kalamdhad, Department of Civil Engineering Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati

Prof. A. Kalamdhad delivered a talk on Decentralized treatment of Biodegradable Solid Waste. He highlighted the evolution, generation and dumping of municipal solid waste in India. He added the importance of the management actions of improper garbage dumping sites. He further explained about centralized and decentralized waste management practice and the drawback in the current waste management system in India. Finally he pointed out

the necessity of composting of biodegradable waste as a quality standard and the sustainable way for addressing waste issue.

**Session II:** The second session was chaired by Dr. D. Marngar, HOD (in-charge), Department of zoology, Synod College

**Lecture-3:** Presented by Prof. Madho Bisht, Department of Environmental Studies, North Eastern Hill University, Shillong.

Prof. Madho Bisht delivered a lecture on the topic "Waste Management in our environment". He said that waste can be potential resources and a multibillion business to many sectors of the society; it just needs proper management and novel ways of use. As such there is nothing like garbage or waste in nature. Everything is energy and a source of sustenance for one and all. To many others waste is an opportunity not a problem. However, improper and unscientific handling of wastes can caused many problems to the environment and affects all forms of life in the biosphere. He also highlighted the amount of waste produced by India particularly the inhabitants of Meghalaya and also waste generated worldwide. He pointed out that huge amount of money have been utilised for waste management worldwide. Different types of municipal waste have been converted to usable forms. He concluded his lecture by quoting "Nothing is waste, everything is a resource or a form to pass energy to another form".

**Lecture-4:** Presented by Shri. B.S. Sohliya, Chief Executive Officer, Shillong Municipal Board, Shillong.

Shri. B.S. Sohliya delivered a lecture on the topic "Waste Management in Shillong". He briefed on the history of Shillong municipality and waste management carried by the different authorities like the Shillong Municipal Board (SMB) in municipality areas, Shillong cantonment board in cantonment areas and the local traditional institutions in other census towns of the state. The speaker highlighted the main activities of SMB like giving awareness and sensitise the public about managing municipal solid waste in a hygienic and scientific manner, segregation of solid waste at source, distribution of colour-coded bins to every household under the ADB & MoHUA funded NERCCDIP. He also discussed on the collection, transportation and treatment of biodegradable, non-biodegradable and hazardous waste produce by residential, institutional, hospitals and commercial areas of Shillong. The speaker also mentioned other waste management activities like installation of TPD compost plant near the landfill site, setting up of waste recovery centre inside and outside of Shillong municipal board and acquisition of new landfill site in the state. He urged and encouraged the inhabitants of Meghalaya to take active participation in waste management starting from the individual level. He also added that members of the community should be stakeholders and contributors to a clean, healthy and green environment.

The webinar features insights on various waste management strategies and offered the participants an opportunity to engaged with leading and prominent speakers who are experts in the field of waste management. At the end of each lecture, participants were offered to posed their queries via chat box and several interesting questions such as issues relating to waste management, monitoring of air emissions from landfills, hazardous waste processing were asked by the participants.

The webinar was ended with vote of thanks by Dr. A.J. Iangrai, Co-ordinator, DBT Star College Scheme.







Report on the Workshop on Sensitisation programme on various statistical indicators as part of Publicity and Information, Education and Communication (IEC) activities, organised by the Office of the District Statistical Officer, East Khasi Hills, Shillong



The Department of Economics, Synod College, Shillong together in collaboration with the District Statistical Officer, East Khasi Hills, Shillong organised a one-day workshop on the Sensitisation programme on various statistical indicators as part of Publicity and Information, Education and Communication (IEC) activities on the 16<sup>th</sup> December 2022 from 9:30 AM to 4 PM.

The workshop started with the registration of the participants and faculty attending the workshop. There was a total of 30 students comprising first, third and sixth-semester Economics Honours students. The workshop started with a welcome speech from Smti I. Rynjah, District Statistical officer welcoming the students, faculty, and staff from the office of the District Statistical Officer, East Khasi Hills, Shillong. Smti. I. The workshop is divided into two sessions:

SESSION 1: Resource person- Shri R. Sumer

The resource person gives insight into the use of statistics in the price showing how CPI is calculated, and how DA for Government employees is calculated. The resource person also explains the various activities carried out by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics which includes using CPI to calculate the DA of Government employees, using statistics for NSSO, calculating and gathering information for the National Income of the state, Census of Government Employees section and providing information through the Publication Section. The resource person also gives practical data for better understanding for the students.

#### SESSION 2: Resource person- Shri R. Sumer

The second session is basically a practical workshop where students are shown through the presentation how to use statistics which otherwise, they learn only in theories. They were shown how the base year changes and why prices fluctuate with regard to the base year. Base year revision can be done only in normal economic times. Thus, in 2017-18 the base year could not be done because in 2016 there is an economic breakdown and similarly in 2020-21 since there is the pandemic.

The workshop concluded with feedback from faculty and students and a concluding remark by Smt C.O.Rani, Inspector of Statistics, Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Shillong.
